



Football Benefitting Local Children



POOLE TOWN FC was founded back in 1890 so has been a part of the fabric of Poole for the past 130 years or so. The club prides itself as being part of its community and holds the FA's Charter Standard Community Club designation, the highest award any football club can hold.

Poole Town Wessex, our youth and community section, which offers football to youth, ladies and ability counts teams, continue to prosper with 30 teams playing below the first team. However, the club has been keen to extend its work within the community and with that in mind set up its Kids Initiative in 2018. The object of the scheme is to involve all local children in the fun of football, especially those facing physical, emotional or financial hardship.

The club now works with local schools and children's charities to provide free coaching, equipment and clothing for the kids most in need. In addition, the club also raises money for charities and worthy causes throughout the year at our numerous social and fund-raising events. News and events, past and future, are reported on our dedicated Kids & Community website, ptfckids.co.uk as well as through our quarterly newsletter which is distributed online as well as by hard copy.

As the Kids Initiative has established itself it has benefited from the support and generosity of local firms who have agreed to sponsor it which in turn has enabled us to expand the scope of what we do.

The Kids Initiative is not a charity but all funds raised and pledged are kept separate in a dedicated bank account. All promotional literature, website and administration costs of the initiative are covered by the Gale Foundation Trust meaning that 100% of all money raised is spent on our frontline work – helping disadvantaged kids.

Coaching

HOLIDAY SOCCER SCHOOLS

Poole Town run holiday football clubs during some of the school half-terms and end of term holidays. The club make a majority of these places available free of charge for children who are supported by local children's charities. Aimed at boys and girls aged between 8-13, all abilities are welcome as the emphasis is on fun. The days involve skills practice, shooting, dribbling, penalty taking as well as matches and min-tournaments. The courses are run by our qualified youth coaches who award medals and trophies on the last day of each school. Each child also receives a Kids Initiative boot bag as a memento.



SCHOOLS COACHING

A number of our coaches and players already teach sports activities within schools and one of our aims is to be able to employ part time coaches enabling them to go into schools and provide coaching where there is no current provision. We also aim to provide regular bespoke coaching sessions to our charities as well. The club are also engaging with schools to help subsidise coaching fees for children who otherwise would not be able to take part in after school football sessions.





CHARITY FUNDRAISING

Nominated Charity

Each year Poole Town nominate a chosen Charity of the Year which becomes the major benefactor of our fundraising efforts. However, through our numerous social and match day events, we raise money for a number of other good causes throughout a season.

In 2018 we raised £1,781 towards the appeal for Julia, a local school girl suffering from Rett's syndrome, through a race night and Rich Brown's half marathon run.



Wave 105 - 1000 Faces

2019 – Wave 105's Cash for Kids became our main charity for the year. The object of a 'Face' is to raise £100 in a year. In this, our second year, we have raised £750, part of that coming from the raffle held during our Summer Ball. In our first year, 2018, we raised £146.



Julia's House

Golf Day, September 2019, raises £300 for local children's hospice, Julia's House, with a draw made for a 'Barrow of Bottles'.



Macmillan Cake Sale

Impromptu cake bake sale and bucket collection at our FA cup game against Hungerford in September 2019 saw us collect £261 which was donated to cancer charity Macmillan.

Sports Kit For Kids



Donation bins are popping up in schools across Dorset

THE BOOT ROOM, launched at the end of 2019, is the latest and most ambitious project undertaken through the Kids Initiative program.

Its inception came through our involvement with local schools whereby we became aware of a recurring issue – many children unable to take part in school sports because they do not have the necessary footwear.

THE BOOT ROOM seeks to address this. The scheme is basically a shoe exchange whereby the club, working with schools and children's charities, will collect donations of preloved boots and trainers and re-distribute them back to

children who do not have any.

Since the announcement of its launch the scheme has attracted a lot of interest and financial support from local companies. Their involvement has enabled us to expand our objectives so that we can provide other equipment such as new shin pads, goal keeping gloves and other clothing.

With thanks to our relationship with Sports Direct, we are able to buy at a reduced rate, new trainers, boots, shin pads and gloves to add to our stock.

MATCH DAY FAMILY TICKETS

Our Free Ticket Vouchers form part of our efforts to involve the wider community of Dorset with the club.

The vouchers are emailed to over 100 schools in Poole, Bournemouth and east Dorset who are invited to send them on to all their children and their families.

The vouchers are issued for at least 2 league games each season and enables 2 adults and 2 children free entry to the selected matches.
