CHILDREN'S HEALTH

On the top floor of the BEACH building, the new purpose-built department for children's health will have two higher dependency beds, an assessment unit and an adolescent area. The unit has predominantly single rooms with space for parents and carers to stay if necessary. It will have safe spaces inside and outside for play and socialising and kitchen facilities for families to use.

There will be a new dedicated 'Gully's Place' suite to provide privacy and dignity for patients and their families when they need it. It is especially for end-of-life care and bereavement support but is also used to help families with the transition to home care after hospital, enabling parents and families to practice often complex care but with the reassurance of staff being nearby.
